

A Regular meeting of the Village Board of Tannersville was held on June 26, 1990 at the Village Hall in Tannersville at 8:00 P.M.

Present at the meeting were:

Mayor Powell opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Trustee Stolz that the minutes be approved.

Mayor Powell seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Police Chief Nieves introduced Robert Loveridge as the new Police Lieutenant to the Village board.

Chief Nieves stated that the police staff including himself totaled 13, 11 part-time and one full time.

The Chief further stated that the summer season schedule will be:-

Tannersville foot patrol on weekdays, on weekends the Hunter force will provide a supervisory patrol, a regular "A line" (11 P.M. to 7 A.M., DWI patrol and a "T2 line" which would run 8 P.M. to 6 A.M. Friday and Saturdays nights) "My department will try to provide the A & P traffic post as needed based on available manpower".

After the Chief and lieutenant left, the Village Board had a discussion.

Attorney Lubow arriving after the Chief had left stated that the "foot patrol does not meet our needs - we should write to the police commission and demand a post at the A & P - we should demand it - in the strongest possible terms, that's where the action is."

Mayor Powell agreed and directed Attorney Lubow to prepare a stiff letter to be sent with the Mayors signature.

The Village has requested official representation on the town's police commission, which is currently composed of Town Councilman Keith Byrne, Hunter Village Mayor Neil Osborn and Haines Falls resident Stephen Monteleone. The Town board has stated that since the three police commission positions are currently filled, Tannersville will not be represented on it at least until a vacancy occurs.

Mayor Powell stated that for years Tannersville has repeatedly tried to have a traffic control post at the A & P parking lot but the request is not done on regular basis.

Miss Diane Sandoval complained tht during the winter the plow removed some of the dirt at the edge of her property causing the water from Penrose Park to enter on to her property.

Village Board members to check this problem.

Anthony Lucido submitted names for complain ts on high grass.

Motion by Mayor Powell that we give proper notification as per ordinance and then proceed as per ordinance.

Trustee Stolz seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Mr. Lucido could not understand why we must give a seven (7) day notice since this is an ordinance, he also complained that the ditches in the village should be cleaned.

An estimate of \$1,550.00 for curbing around the Fire House-Village Hall was received from Anthony Lucido.

Motion by Trustee Stolz that Anthony lucido proceed with curbing as per estimated sum of \$1,550.00.

Mayor Powell seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Mayor Powell stated that Mr. Weismann cleaned up his property and thanked him for his cooperation.

A letter received from Mrs. Lillian Wolfson asking for a light to be installed on Spring Street -"a large area of the street is very dark". Mayor Powell will contact Central Hudson to see what can be done and also to check area where Fred Haines lives on Sylvan Lane as both of these sections are very dark.

A request for a water hook-up outside of the Village was received from Attorney Susan Kohan.

mayor Powell said that the Village of Tannersville has been in litigation with DEC over water usage since 1987, further stating the Village could not hook up anyone outside the village, -we have turned down other requests. We have to abide by what the state says.

Attorney Lubow raised some questions, Mayor Powell said he would table same for our next meeting at which time Trustee Reich would be present.

A request was received from Planning Board Chairman Mark Hyer that we purchase a tape recorder.

Motion by Trustee Stolz authorizing Mr. Hyer to purchase the tape recorder.

Mayor Powell seconded the motion. motion carried.

A letter received from Greene County Planning Board that there exists a vacancy.

Mayor Powell will contact Director Ron Roth regarding the above.

Motion by Mayor Powell the Village of Tannersville, Town of Hunter and Village of Hunter have all agreed that we need Flag People to control traffic while mountain road is under construction.

Trustee Stolz seconded the motion. Motion carried.




Motion by Trustee Stolz meeting be adjourned.
