

A public hearing was held on Tuesday, September 23, 2003 at the Village Hall.

The purpose of this meeting was to gain responses and ideas from the Village Residents for two new entrance signs to the Village.

Due to the significant lack of Village residents attending the meeting, no formal meeting was held. Jim Plank and Fred Johnsen interviewed the Mayor about the sign proposals for the Village.

The Mayor discussed with the reporters that he would like to have the history of Tannersville exhibited in the signs, and using the nickname "Village in the Sky". He also stated that in the design, he would like to see some hemlocks and heritage, including tanning, coinciding with the logos on the proposed new flags for the Village.

Mayor Weyant will be leading the project, but will ask artists (e.g. Elena Patterson) for their suggestions. However, suggestions are welcome from all residents as well. He will also contact Justine Hommel for some history on the Village.


Mr. Planck asked what the intended size of the signs were, and the Mayor replied that possibly 8'x 8', a little bigger than the Village of Hunter sign. He mentioned that there could possibly be a ladder on each side listing the Village Businesses.

Mr. Johnsen asked what the time frame goal was on the signs, and the Mayor replied that if we kept the schedule aggressive, then the signs are to be engineered by mid October, and completed before the winter holidays.

Mr. Johnsen also asked how the Village would be paying for the new signs. The Mayor stated that the Village business owners are paying sign fees and have been for the past couple years and that sign fee money is to be used for attaining new Village Signs. It is not general revenue.

Mr. Planck reviewed some of the same questions that Mr. Johnsen had asked prior.

The meeting was informally over.
