WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Tannersville has held a observation period open to the public to review and comment on the proposed master plan;

WHEREAS, that upon review of the public comment, the Village Board has in conjunction with J. Kenneth Fraser and Associates, has prepared a final copy of the proposed Master Plan;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village of Tannersville Board of Trustees hereby adopts this Village of Tannersville Master Plan with the authority to alter projects in the need of importance, as emergencies or priority elements arise.
